The Chicago Christmas Day Itinerary: A list of places to check out in Chicago when everything seems to be closed

- 1. Skydeck Chicago 233 South Wacker Dr, Chicago, IL
- Believe it or not, you can get some pretty amazing views of the city, plus 3 other neighboring states on Christmas day! The Chicago Skydeck, a typical but very cool Chicago tourist stop opens on Christmas day from 10am-8pm! Enterance is \$24 for adults and \$16 for children.
- 2. Lincoln Park Zoo 2001 North Clark Street, Chicago IL
- I know this one is already on the list of things to do while in Chicago during the holidays, however it doesn't mean you can't go 2 or 3 more times:) especially if we have a warmer Christmas day, definitely take advantage of that and be outside! Entrance is free:)
- 3. **McCormick Tribune Ice Rink** 1 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago IL
- This one was also on the main list, however it's for a good reason. It's one of the few places of actual entertainment that is open during Christmas day! Check it out! They open from 10am-4pm.

- 4. **Navy Pier** 600 East Grand Avenue, Chicago IL
- Though the Winter WonderFest won't actually be open on Christmas day, Navy Pier itself will be open if you want to roam around and walk inside for a bit. They have some pretty cool things to look at in there including cultural attractions and free art exhibitions. Entrance is free:)
- 5. **Legoland** 601 North Martingale Road, Schaumburg, IL
- This option would require a car just because it is not in the city! Schaumburg is around a 40 minute car ride to the west of the city. However if you're into Legos and overall fun, you should try to make it here! They have lego-themed rides and various attractions. Opening hours are 10am-4pm, and tickets start at \$15 online and \$20 at the door.
- 6. **Garfield Park Observatory** 300 North Central Park Avenue, Chicago IL
- Step into a moment of summer while in it's winter outside at the Garfield Park Observatory! Think of it as a botanical garden, just indoors; especially great to have when you're dealing with freezing Chicago temperatures. Entrance is free.
- 7. John Hancock Center 875 North Michigan Avenue, Chicago IL
- After checking out the views from the Skydeck, make sure to make your way over to the John Hancock Center for some extreme views of the city! Entrance starts at \$22 for adults and \$15 for children.
- 8. Cloud Gate AKA The Bean 201 E Randolph St, Chicago, IL 60602
- Last but certainly not least, make sure you make your way to visit our beloved Bean at Millennium Park. Because it'll be Christmas
